ABOUT THE DIVISION OF AGEING

The Division of Ageing was established in 2003 and is part of the Ministry of the People and Social Development. It is responsible for policy-making and program development regarding the elderly in our community.

WHAT IS A SENIOR ACTIVITY CENTRE?

Senior Activity Centres are multi-service facilities where older persons can come together for educational and recreational activities that enhance their independence and encourage their involvement in their communities.

The Ministry of the People and Social Development, through the Division of Ageing, partners with Non-Governmental Organizations to operate Senior Activity Centres as a component of the Continuum of Health and Social Support Services for Older Persons.

FUNCTIONS OF THE SENIOR ACTIVITY CENTRE

Senior Activity Centres provide older persons with an environment where they can interact with their peers through educational and recreational activities, outings and social events.

They allow older persons to engage in interests such as Cooking, Gardening and Jewelry making and foster a sense of self—worth and dignity among older persons through social interaction, development and learning.

Through involvement in Senior Activity Centres in their communities, older persons are encouraged to lead healthy, active lives.
