## SEED DISTRIBUTION CEREMONY

## Good morning

I am pleased to welcome you today to the *Ministry of Social Development and Family Services*' distribution ceremony, which celebrates the Ministry's investment in the beneficiaries of the Sowing Empowerment Entrepreneurial Development (SEED) Grant. Today's ceremony reiterates the Government's commitment to the expansion of the economy by supporting those most vulnerable amongst us.

As a nation, we continue to grapple with the effects that the economic uncertainty brought on by the COVID-19 pandemic has caused. In spite of this, our citizens have demonstrated their perseverance and innovation in these challenging times.

The Ministry of Social Development and Family Services, tasked with leading the charge for addressing the social challenges of poverty, social inequality and social exclusion in society, is dedicated to provide support as we forge ahead in recovery mode as a nation, charting a new direction for the economy and the nation, in the context of a new normal.

The MSDFS has prioritized building a secure social safety net system with the intention of guiding the transition from that of beneficiary to that of a self-sufficient income earner. Hence, the retention and creation of jobs, particularly through MSMEs is expected to lead to an enhanced quality of life for our vulnerable populations.

The Ministry, through this Sowing Empowerment through Entrepreneurial Development (SEED) grant, continues to provide much needed support through advocacy, advice and start-up initiatives and funding; to those desirous of starting a small business, growing an existing one, or engaging in skills training and development through our Adult Education Programme (AEP) and other similar offerings.

This Programme targets micro-entrepreneurs within our communities who cannot access traditional loan facilities and provides grant funding in the sums of a maximum of \$15,000.00 TTD for the purchase of goods and/or equipment, as well as, up to \$7,500 TTD in further funding to facilitate skills training at a recognized / accredited institution. Training is provided in Financial and Records Management, Marketing, Customer Service and Entrepreneurial Mindset.

Just a few days ago, the Ministry acknowledged the global observance of the United Nations' Micro, Small and Medium-sized Enterprises (MSMEs) Day 2021. This commemoration seeks to encourage increased awareness about the contribution of MSMEs to sustainable development and promoting creativity and innovation. Numerous MSMEs locally have demonstrated their resilience by making the adjustments necessary for business continuity. Several have begun to digitalize their operations and services, while others have seized the opportunity to diversify their products and services. This has endorsed our view that MSMEs are central to the revitalization of our local economy and are we are delighted that our SEED grant can serve as a catalyst to the development of these small and micro entrepreneurs. The SEED grant aligns seamlessly with the objectives of our National Social Mitigation Plan, which lays out a strategy to lessen the impact of the economic downturn on vulnerable citizens while simultaneously fostering a spirit of resilience amongst our people.

The Ministry believes that in keeping with its mandate, there is an obligation to partner with NGOS, FBOs and other stakeholders to ensure that vulnerable individuals, groups and families receive the assistance they require. As such, the necessity for collaboration with regards to our SEED programme is no different and several

opportunities are being explored to enhance the offerings under the programme. These include possible partnerships with YTEPP, NEDCO and the Ministry of Youth Development and National Service.

I have been made aware that the beneficiaries of this programme include persons who are welfare recipients and who live in unfortunate situations of lack and are interested in establishing a micro-small business venture or receiving skills training. I commend these participants for their willingness to work towards improvement of their current circumstances, especially considering our current economic climate.

Even as the Government of Trinidad and Tobago works diligently to plot a path to a brighter future following the economic impacts posed by COVID-19, entrepreneurship is regarded as a way to respond to the social needs of citizens during this time.

Please allow me to share with you, a story of success of another SEED recipient which I hope would encourage you to be persistent in your entrepreneurial pursuit. Ms. Kimbale Rogers-Mc Lean received assistance from the SEED programme to purchase sewing materials for her business. At the time of her application, she was self-employed however her business earnings were insufficient and upon assessment, her household which includes one (1) minor child was deemed to be below the poverty line.

Since receiving the SEED grant in 2020 the client was able to transform her business. While there was reduced demand for bridal and formal wear, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Ms. Rogers McLean adjusted her business model and took advantage of the lock down by designing and creating professional wear for persons who gained weight during the stay at home measures and needed to return to work. This was so successful that she was able to purchase an additional sewing machine. She has since extended her business to create ready to wear styles and advertises via her business Facebook page VES Styles.

Ms. Rogers- Mc Lean is very appreciative of the grant and what it has done to transform her life. When reassessed, her business earnings now put her now above the poverty line.

Ladies and gentlemen, you too can be like Ms Rogers –McLean. Your acceptance of this grant today, serves as a display of your commitment to yourselves, your families, communities, and the nation at large, that you desire to transform your lives and build a better future for your loved ones and communities. You are declaring today that you are not limited by your present circumstances, and that in spite of the challenges that lie ahead, you are motivated by an unquenchable determination to thrive.

I therefore encourage you to work closely with the Case Officer assigned to you, not only during the difficult times, but also to share news about your progress.
