The mistreatment of the elderly can take many forms, including *physical*, *emotional*, *sexual abuse*, *financial exploitation*, and *neglect*, *the* majority of which goes unreported for many reasons.

Elder abuse can have numerous physical and emotional effects on victims:

- Victims become fearful and anxious they experience issues with trust;
- Victims suffer physical injuries- cuts, scratches, bruises, head injuries, broken

bones, pain and soreness which contributes to long term disabilities; and

• Victims are exposed to premature death.

HOW CAN WE PREVENT ELDER ABUSE?

The World Heath Organization outlines Elderly Abuse that occurs in two (2) situations:

- 1) Elderly Abuse in Community Settings (family members, care givers, and members of the community
- students, employees & residents)
- 2) Elderly Abuse in Institutional Settings (Hospitals, Government Agencies, & Private Institutions)

Therefore, prevention measures must be tailored at both the <u>community</u> level and at the <u>institutional</u> level in order to effectively reduce Elder Abuse

- Have a Community Registry so that authorities are aware of the older persons within the community and their unique circumstances which aids in monitoring
- Host public forums to sensitize & educate the community, older persons and their guardians on ageing issues
- Encourage intergenerational approaches by encouraging school children & adults to volunteer at Senior Activity Centres



INSTITUTIONAL LEVEL

- Introduce Financial Literacy & Retirement
 Planning seminars for older persons & public
 officers to reduce financial exploitation
- Have Public-Private Partnerships with local security firms to provide an alert system/ panic button which alerts authorities of elderly abuse
- Accredit & standardize caregiving training courses at local/regional educational institutions
- Develop safe houses and emergency shelters for the elderly

- Ensure policies operate in the interest of the target group rather than the institution
- Set up an organization tailored towards providing support to elders like the Children's Authority i.e., revamping the Senior Citizens Bureau
- Institute a mandate that trained authorities be proactive and check up regularly on the elderly within communities
- Further review of the Homes for Older Persons Act 2007 and ensure proper implementation of the Community Care Programme by the MSDFS

- Ensure that all schools conduct the necessary training & sensitizing students on nationwide ageing issues
- Ensure via the TTPS and other relevant authorities that complaints of elder abuse are investigated thoroughly
- Monitor and coordinate the implementation of the National Policy on Ageing and ensure Public-Private Partnerships in the implementation of the National Plan of Action on Ageing

- Listen to older adults and their primary caregivers to understand their challenges
 - Educate yourself on recognizing the signs of elder abuse
 - · Check-in on older adults who may have few friends and family members.
- Provide assistance where possible, to over-burdened caregivers (e.g., assisting with meal preparation or volunteering to spend time with the older adult)
 - Speak up when you see an elderly person being abused
 - Report cases of abuse or suspected abuse to the TTPS
 - Start at home by caring for your elders
