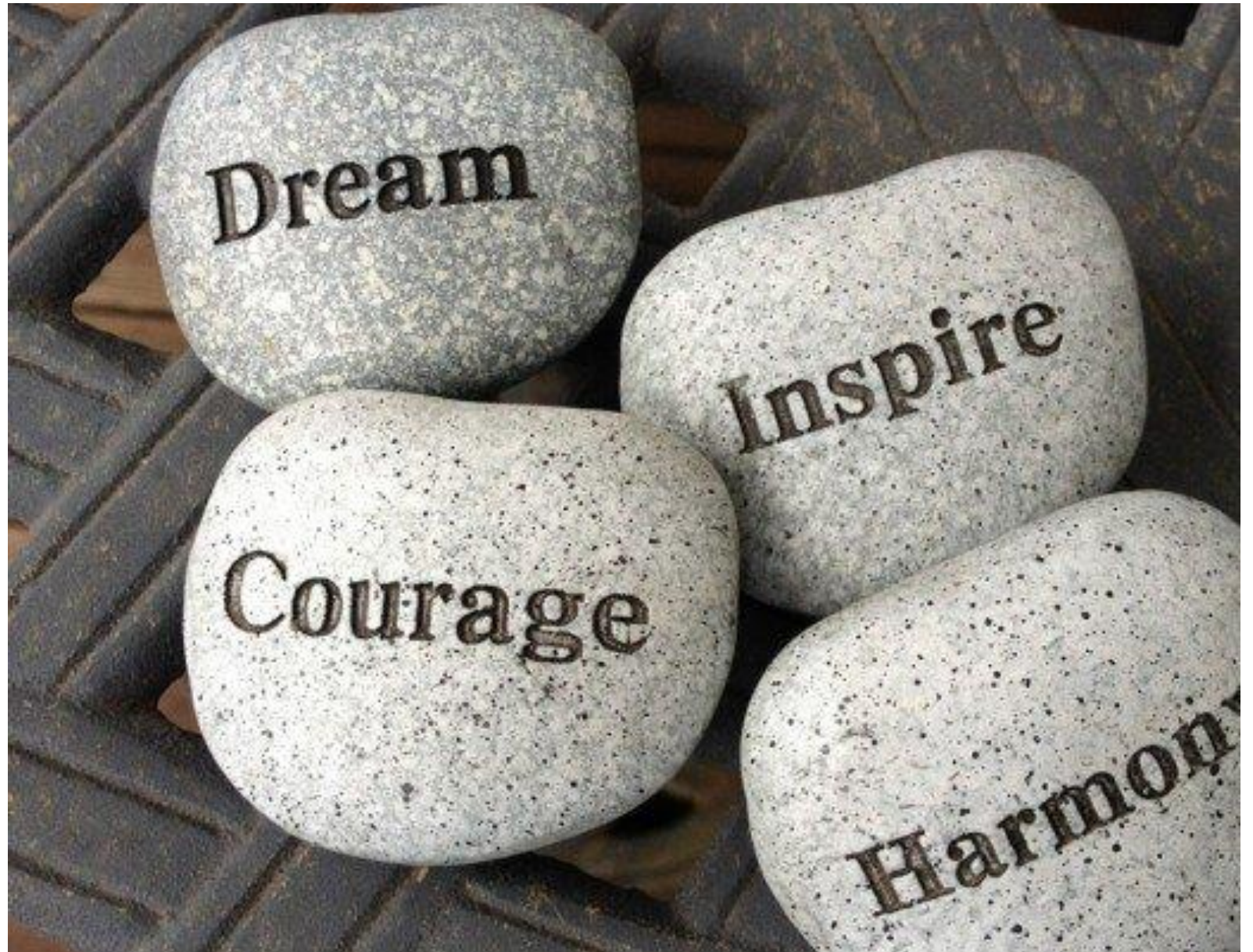

KAYAPA SOCIAL WORK

Boodram (2022)

- The word 'gayap' is derived from the indigenous Karinya (Carib) word 'kayapa' – a term which describes the tradition of people getting together to complete a huge task, like clearing land, building a structure, or planting and reaping.
- commitment to those who are most marginalized and vulnerable
- Practice that is based on Caribbean shared values of community, humanity, kindness and vigorous pursuit of social work's highest ideals (socio-structural) such as social justice, and human rights.
